Instructions for determining the Most Improved Golfer
Add 12 to the player's Handicap Index at the start date. This value is A. Add 12 to the player's Handicap Index at the end date. This value is B.

Divide value A by value B, calculating to three decimal places. This is the improvement factor. The player with the highest improvement factor should receive the most improved player award. Example:

Starting Handicap Index: 24.3 | Ending Handicap Index: 16.2 Value A: 24.3 + 12 = 36.3 | Value B: 16.2 + 12 = 28.2 A / B: 36.3 / 28.2 = 1.128

Improvement factor: 1.128

Happenings in the past! October 1984 – "FORTY YEARS AGO"!

We have members of our club that had not been born 40 years ago, so this is a bit of a "history lesson" for them. And speaking of members, there were 258 members of the Canyon Lake Men's Golf Club in October 1984. It was also time to renew your annual membership. If you renewed before November 1, the dues were \$35. If you renewed on or after November 1, the dues were \$45. A membership renewal application was included in the October bulletin for convenience. As it is currently, October was CLMGC Board election time and there were two (2) candidates for President and six (6) candidates for Director, requiring formal mailed ballots.

October was also the month in which the **Golf Cart Stag Day Tournament** was held. In those days, a golf cart was the main drawing prize, compared to today's cash award. It was reported that plans for the building of restrooms on holes #6 and #16 were progressing, and that the CLMGC was being asked by the POA to contribute \$10,000 to the project. (A pee fee?) The restrooms are still in use.

October 1994 – "THIRTY YEARS AGO"!

It was "golf course overseeding time" 30 years ago, and the CLMGC and the After Lunch Bunch each announced two "away games" while the course was closed. The bulletin indicates that current CLMGC members Bob Stinson and Kevin O'Leary winners on Wednesday Golf or Saturday "Early Bird" golf. They're like "Die Hard Batteries", they're still going. It was also Men's Golf Club Board election time, and there were three (3) candidates for President and seven (7) candidates for Director. The minutes of the September Board meeting indicate that the Treasurer "Gave a treasurers report". That's it – he gave a report! Stag Day was reported as very successful with 206 players. The winner of the Custom Club Car Golf Cart bought two (2) \$35 drawing tickets. Not a bad ROI. The golf cart was purchased from Great American Golf, owned by Bob Stinson. First, second and third runners up won a full set of woods and irons and a golf bag, a full set of irons and a full set of woods, respectively. The dinner and drawing were held at the Lodge.

October 2004 – "TWENTY YEARS AGO"!

Flash back 20 years and Mike Cannavino was the CLMGC President, Lori Cobb was the Women's Golf Club President and Dave Lindeman was the PGA Golf Professional. The golf course was in the process of getting ready to close for overseeding and the CLMGC had just completed their Stag Day Tournament. The Stag Day tournament had 190 players in six (6) flights, with morning and afternoon starting times. All 360 drawing tickets were sold out by noon on the day of the tournament, and the winner of the drawing, Frank Romo, received \$5,000.

Current member Fred Hemborg, 2004 Membership Director, reported that the membership of the club was 483 and the Women's Golf Club had 195 members. Men's and Women's Golf Club past presidents Valerie and Travis Montgomery retired on October 1, 2004 and became official full-time residents of Canyon Lake. Things haven't been the same since then. Hmmmm!

Overseeding

It is getting close to that time of the year when we scalp the fairways, rough, tees and green surrounds and re-seed with new turf. What I am describing is the process of "Overseeding". Many of you have been through this process in the past but there may be some who do not understand why it is performed each year. In the following paragraphs I will explain why we do it, why it is so important to close the course for 20 days and why we only overseed certain areas

When golf courses are designed for the Southern California Region the architects will typically specify that tees, fairways and roughs to be planted with a warm season turf species of Cynodon dactylon (bermudagrass). Bermudagrass is chosen because of its heat tolerance, drought tolerance, rapid recovery rate and nominal fertilizer requirements. The one downfall with bermudagrass is that as the hours of sunlight decrease and the temperatures drop, the turf will begin to enter into dormancy. This is usually during the winter months of November through February. To disguise the brown color of dormancy, golf courses have chosen to overseed their bermudagrass with a variety of cool season turf known as *Lolium perenne* (perennial ryegrass). Perennial ryegrass is the overseeding turf of choice because of its rapid establishment and its dark green color. This is where we run into trouble. As the name states, Perennial ryegrass is a perennial, meaning that it will survive for more than one season if conditions are favorable. Favorable conditions include ample moisture, afternoon shade and mowing heights of 1" or above. Because of this the turf at Canyon Lake has a mottled look where perennial ryegrass from previous seasons has made it through the year and has out-competed the bermudagrass. As summer temperatures climb above 86°F the perennial ryegrass will begin to burn out leaving thin areas throughout the course. Once the perennial ryegrass has died, it will not come back and must be re-seeded. Therefore, the course is overseeded every year to maintain a uniform, dark green color and superior playing conditions for the majority of the year.


There are several important steps involved in the overseeding process. First is seed-bed preparation then seed application followed by seed germination, seed establishment and finally the first cut. All steps require a certain amount of time to complete with a total time table of approximately 20 days.

Seed-bed preparation is very important and involves several steps that take 3-5 days to complete. Seed application will usually take 2 days with a day or two of touch up. Seed germination requires excess watering and takes on averages 7-10 days. It is extremely important to keep the seed moist at all times. The irrigation system will be turning on throughout the day to ensure that the seed remains moist. Seed establishment is the time period in which the seedling sends its root down into the soil and begins the uptake of nutrients. This time period is between 6-7 days after germination but may take longer. The final step will be the "first cut". The first cut on any seedling cannot be performed until that seedling is well-rooted into the soil. The first cut will also be at a much higher height than standard mowing heights.


As you can see the 20 days of course closure is a minimum requirement and is based on a best-case scenario. All areas that have been overseeded must remain wet for several days in order to germinate the seed. The irrigation system will be programmed to water several times throughout the day ensuring that the seed stays moist. For this reason, the golf course must be closed to traffic. When the golf course re-opens the juvenile seedlings will be week and must be protected from cart traffic. Depending on the rate of establishment, the turf may or may not have been mowed for the first time. Golf cart traffic is the primary cause of turf damage therefore carts must remain on the cart paths during this particular time. Expect carts to remain on the paths for approximately three weeks after re-opening. This will allow the new turf to become established before being subject to golf carts.
